## Camp Wisdom

### October 26 - 28, 2007

## General Information

**(Webelos)Parent's Meeting:** Have a parent's meeting before you go camping to find out who has camping equipment and to get them involved. Go over with the boys and their parents what they need to bring for the weekend to be prepared.

Attend Camping 101 on October 18 to get more tips on how to prepare for a successful campout.

**Campsites:** Each den will be assigned to a campsite adequate for the number of Webelos and adults they register. Last minute additions may cause overcrowding at your campsite. Please try to have your registration as accurate as possible and let the registrar know of any late additions.

**Two –Deep Leadership:** All units attending this activity must comply with the BSA policy requiring that “two registered adult leaders or a registered adult and a parent of a participating Scout, one of whom must be at least 21 years of age or older, are required for all trips or outings.” We encourage each Webelos Scout to have his parent attend also.

**Vehicles and Parking:** No motorized vehicles will be parked in the campsites at any time. Only vehicles with the equipment will be allowed to drive near the campsite to unload and then move to the parking area to allow everyone the opportunity to approach their campsite. All other vehicles with passengers will park in the lot and walk to their campsite. Unauthorized vehicles will be towed.  
**CARPOOL, CARPOOL, CARPOOL!!!**

Only properly marked Staff or Handicapped vehicles will be permitted in camp.

**Cooking and Sanitation:** Each den will be responsible for their own cooking and must furnish their own food, ice, cooking gear, stoves/fuel, charcoal, etc. Be sure to bring your own trash bags.

**Food:** Plan to eat dinner before you come on Friday. Bring enough food for Saturday breakfast, lunch, dinner, and Sunday breakfast. Keep Saturday lunch simple, sandwiches are great.

**Water:** Water is available, but it may be located several hundred yards from your campsite. Be sure to bring containers to transport the water to your campsite.

**Weather:** Be prepared for changing weather. At this time of year temperature changes occur frequently especially during a 24-hour period. Help your boys plan for the changing weather conditions. Don't forget the rain!

**First Aid:** There will not be a designated first aid station however we will have medical staff on hand for any Scout or Adult needing assistance. Information concerning the location of the medical staff will be issued at the leaders/patrol leaders meeting on Friday evening. Dens should plan to take care of minor medical needs and keep track of any prescription medications carried by members of their unit.

**Alcoholic Beverages /Tobacco Products:** Alcoholic beverages are NOT permitted at any Scouting functions. Anyone found possessing or consuming alcoholic beverages will be required to leave the camp. The use of any tobacco product is discouraged at any time at a BSA event.

- 1:30 pm      Skill Events resume
- 4:45 pm      Closing Flag Ceremony
- 5:00 pm      Dinner
- 8:00 pm      Campfire
- 10:30 pm      Lights out – Quiet time

## Sunday

- 7:00 am      Breakfast
- 8:30 am      Flag Ceremony and religious observance
- 10:00 am      Check out – campsites must be inspected by a camp staffer and given the all clear prior to leaving the camp grounds. Patches will be given once the site has passed inspection.

## Frequently Asked questions about Webelos Woods

- Q. What are the bathrooms like up at camp? We have several moms and dads coming and wanted to know what to tell them.
- A. Bathrooms are located at most campsites. Some have two separate sides – one of which can be designated for women and the other for men. Sometimes it gets confusing when it is dark as to which bathroom is which – so take a buddy who will stand outside while the other person is using the bathroom.
- Q. My younger son is a Bear Cub Scout. Can he come also?
- A. Only Webelos Scouts and their parents and leaders are expected to attend this event. Younger or older siblings even if they are Cub Scouts are **not** allowed to attend this event. Older siblings who are registered Boy Scouts should attend with their troops.
- Q. Our den has a den chief who wants to come – can he attend?
- A. Yes as long as he understands that his role is as a helper not a participant.
- Q. Some of our Webelos don't have a parent or guardian who can come to the campout. Does this mean that they can't attend?
- A. Webelos should have their parent or guardian attend, but this shouldn't prevent any boy from coming if his parent or guardian is unable to attend. Try to maintain a ratio of 1 adult per every 3 Webelos. Consider asking another parent who will be at the camp with their son to keep up with the Webelos Scout whose parent or guardian can't attend.
- Q. I have sleep apnea and require a breathing machine for sleeping. Is there electricity at the campsite?
- A. No electricity at campsites. You will need a battery pack for your machine. You will be able to recharge your machine up at the dining hall if necessary.
- Q. We can't come on Friday evening but would like to participate in the events on Saturday. Can we still come?
- A. Yes – even if your group can't come on Friday (or a few can't come on Friday), just register as usual – the cost is still the same and indicate when you will be coming on your registration form.
- Q. What will we have at our campsite to sit on or eat on?
- A. You will need to bring your own chairs and table to sit on and eat at.
- Q. What kind of training or information can I get before coming to camp that will help our den be better prepared for the campout.
- A. Camping 101 held on Thursday, Oct. 18 will help you with preparations for camping. It is also advised that at least one of your leaders sign up and take the Outdoor Webelos Leader (OWL) training held on October 13 & 14. Both activities will help you be better prepared to take your group camping. Leaders should plan to share information with their den & parents prior to the campout.
